Dear Colleagues

Welcome to Oslo, welcome to the University of Oslo!

It is an honour to host the 11th ECPR General Conference, and a pleasure to share the academic and social programme with you. We hope you will enjoy the conference, and the city of Oslo. We will in particular emphasise the plenary session and the Roundtables, for which we – as local organisers – are responsible.

The Plenary Lecture by Johan P. Olsen on *Democratic Accountability and the Changing European Political Order* will address ongoing transformations of the political organisation of Europe.

The lecture will take place in the University ceremonial hall, the Aula. The Aula is the university's most famous building, decorated with 11 large oil paintings by Edvard Munch, which are the only decorations by Munch that can still be viewed in their original context.

Following the Plenary Lecture, we will walk to the spectacular Oslo Opera House for the opening reception. The building is situated at the head of the Oslofjord, centrally in the city. The Opera House, which was completed in 2007, won the culture award at the World Architecture Festival in Barcelona in 2008 and the 2009 European Union Prize for Contemporary Architecture.

The two Roundtables hosted by our Department of Political Science take up crucial issues for Europe and for European political science. What will be the future of the European welfare states? How can we expect gender (in)equality to develop in the future? The issues for the Plenary Lecture and the Roundtables are described in more detail elsewhere in this programme.

Celebrating our 60th anniversary this year, the Department of Political Science was founded in 1957 and conducts research and teaching in all areas of political science. The department currently has about 80 members of staff, and about 1,200 programme students at all levels.

The Faculty of Social Sciences comprises five departments and several research centres. Two of these are ARENA – Centre for European Studies and C-REX – Center for Research on Extremism. The faculty organises the Oslo Summer School in Comparative Social Science Studies, which provides several PhD research courses that aim to cover all academic disciplines in the social sciences. Each year, around 200 students from European countries and elsewhere participate in the courses.

We wish you a successful conference and a wonderful stay in Oslo.

Klaus Goetz (above) holds the Chair in Political Systems and European Integration at the University of Munich. He previously taught at LSE and at the University of Potsdam.

He has held Visiting Professorships at Humboldt University Berlin, the University of Tokyo, the Institute of Advanced Studies Vienna, Hebrew University Jerusalem, and Sciences Po Bordeaux, and he was a Fernand Braudel Fellow at the EUJ.

Klaus Goetz's work focuses on comparative politics and public policy, with a special interest in the analysis of political time. He is currently engaged in two major research projects, both funded by the German Research Foundation, that examine budgeting in international organisations and resource mobilisation for international refugee policy, respectively. He recently co-edited (with Ronny Patz) a special issue of the journal *Global Policy* on 'Resourcing International Organizations'.

He was local organiser of the 2009 ECPR General Conference in Potsdam and has been co-editor of the journal *West European Politics* (Taylor & Francis) since 2000.

Maurizio Carbone (right) is Professor of International Relations & Development and Jean Monnet Professor of EU External Policies at the University of Glasgow.

He has taught previously at the University of Pittsburgh, Carnegie Mellon University, Duke University, Johns Hopkins Bologna, University of Rome Tor Vergata, and has held official visiting research positions at the Université Libre de Bruxelles, University of Canterbury in New

Zealand, European University Institute, University of Cambridge, Sciences Po Paris, University of Cologne, and University of Bologna.

Maurizio Carbone's research is related mainly to EU external relations, particularly foreign aid and other development-related policies. He is also interested in European integration, international development, and Italy's role in the international arena. He was local organiser of the 2014 ECPR General Conference in Glasgow and is a founding editor of the journal *Contemporary Italian Politics* (Taylor & Francis).

Out and about in the city

Norway's capital is transforming into a cosmopolitan hub with an abundance of museums and restaurants, while maintaining the relaxed atmosphere of a much smaller town

Oslo is one of Europe's fastest-growing cities, with a population approaching 700,000 and new neighbourhoods boasting eye-catching architecture. The city is nestled between the Oslofjord

and hundreds of square miles of forested hills, and is a green city in more ways than one. The compact city centre is easily explored on foot or by bike, and an efficient public transport system makes the whole city accessible without a car.

Norway's capital since 1814, Oslo is home to the Norwegian government and the Royal Family.

The country's largest cultural institutions, which include the Norwegian Opera & Ballet, the National Theatre and the National Museum of Art, Architecture and Design, present first-rate art exhibitions and opera, ballet and theatre performances.

Other top attractions include the Munch Museum, Holmenkollen Ski Jump, and Vigeland Sculpture Park.

The University of Oslo

Founded in 1811, the University of Oslo is Norway's oldest institution of higher education, and is highest ranked in the country for both education and research

Today only the Faculty of Law remains in the old university buildings on Oslo's main street, Karl Johan. The main campus Blindern, with its interesting modern architecture surrounded by parkland, lies a few kilometres outside the city centre.

A leading European university

The University of Oslo is ranked 58th in the world and 18th in Europe in the 2015 Shanghai World Ranking. With five Nobel Prize winners, UiO has a strong track record of pioneering research and scientific discovery.

The University has almost 28,000 students enrolled in degree programmes across eight faculties: Theology, Law, Medicine, Humanities, Mathematics and Natural Sciences, Dentistry, Social Sciences, and Education.

UiO coordinates ten National Centres of Excellence, a Centre for Research-based Innovation, seven Marie Curie Training Sites and

museums such as the Viking Ship Museum and the Botanical Garden.

A globally engaged university

Events

Each year, the ECPR organises the Joint Sessions of Workshops, Summer and Winter Schools in Methods and Techniques, and the General Conference. A Graduate Student Conference has been held in even years, until 2016.

Publishing

We have our own imprint, ECPR Press, publishing high-quality **Monographs** and collections of **Essays**, along with a small selection of out-of-print **Classics** that have made a significant contribution

to political studies scholarship. Our imprint also includes a highly respected series of multi-authored edited volumes, **Studies in European Political Science**, many of which have developed from workshops at the ECPR's Joint Sessions and Research Sessions.

ECPR also co-publishes three leading journals: *European Political Science* with Palgrave Macmillan, *European Journal of Political Research* with Wiley-Blackwell and *European Political Science Review* with Cambridge University Press. We also publish the high-profile book series *Comparative Politics* with Oxford University Press.

Standing Groups and Research Networks

These are groups of researchers, in many cases formed at ECPR events, with a shared scholarly interest. Some are small, maintaining only a website and mailing list; some organise major conferences and summer schools, and produce their own publications.

There are currently over 50 Standing Groups, covering many sub-fields of the discipline. All are eligible to apply for grants to help with the running of summer schools and organisation of other major activities.

Prizes

Each year, the ECPR marks its members' achievements by awarding a number of prizes. These prizes cover the spectrum of a scholar's career, from the Jean Blondel PhD Prize to the Lifetime Achievement Award.

Membership

ECPR membership is institutional and currently comprises some 340 universities concerned with the teaching and research of political science.

While membership is paid by the university, it is the individuals within it who receive the benefit; from Master's and PhD students, through to the most senior professor.

Plenary Lecture

Johan P. Olsen delivers this year's Plenary, on *Democratic Accountability and the Changing European Political Order*

Ongoing transformations of the political organisation of Europe, where the nation-state and the European Union are challenged, make it possible to explore phenomena that are difficult to see in more stable periods.

The upsurge of accountability demands, where political leaders are required to explain and justify what they are doing and not doing, is one such phenomenon.

Assuming stable principal-agent relations may give insight into the routines of institutional accountability.

But it is not enough to analyse how accountability processes contribute to routinised maintenance of an established order within relatively stable, simple, and well-known situations. We need to understand accountability in eras of institutional confusion and contestation and in dynamic, complex, and unknown situations.

First, variations in the relations

between democratic accountability and political association, organisation, and agency are endogenous to democratic politics and government.

Second, accountability processes take place within settled and unsettled orders. They can be order-maintaining and order-transforming.

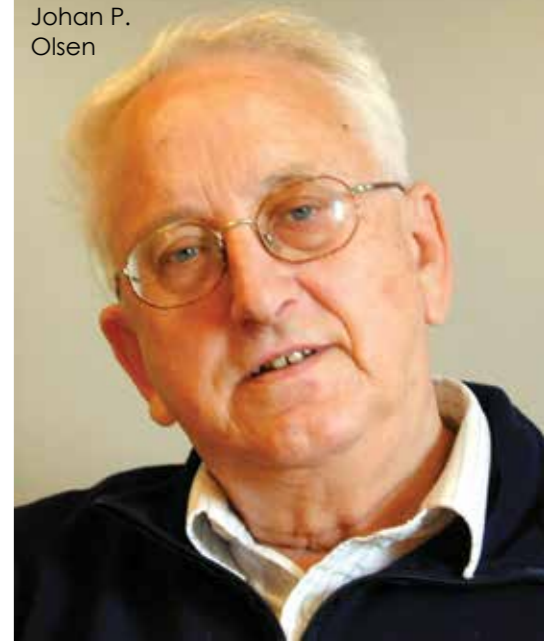
Third, accountability involves sense-making as well as decision-making.

Fourth, accountability may attract public attention and involve mass mobilisation or go on largely unnoticed by the public.

Fifth, accountability processes may or may not foster new ideas about political order, democratic government, and the role of rank-and-file citizens in political life. They may or may not foster democracy as a particular form of political community, organisation, and governance, and affect what democracy will mean and imply in the future.

He has published in many international journals and among his books are: Europe in Search of Political Order (2007), Governing through Institution Building, Institutional Theory and Recent European Experiments in Political Organization (2010) and Democratic Accountability, Political order and Change (forthcoming 2017) – all with Oxford University Press. Rediscovering Institutions: The Organizational Basis of Politics (1989) and Democratic Governance (1995) – both with James G. March – were published by The Free Press, New York.

ECPR Director

In September 2013, **Martin Bull** (University of Salford) was appointed as the ECPR's first Director. Martin oversees the running of the Central Services, directs ECPR operations, and advises and assists the EC with the organisation's strategic direction.

He has considerable experience in ECPR matters, having served as its Academic Director 2006 – 2013, and on its Executive Committee 2003 – 2006.

ECPR Chair

The Chair is elected by the Executive Committee every three years coinciding with the changeover between Committees, and as such they serve a three-year term. The current Chair is **Rudy Andeweg** (Universiteit Leiden) who will serve until April 2018. The Chair takes the lead in the strategic direction of the organisation and works closely with the Vice Chair and Treasurer, as well as chairing meetings of the Executive Committee.

In recognition of the need to have a Chair experienced in ECPR business, in the preceding autumn the outgoing EC elects a Chair Designate from those members who have another three years to serve.

The ECPR's Executive Committee (EC) is a Board of twelve Trustees, elected by the Council of Official Representatives. The EC, which meets twice a year, is responsible for the day-to-day running of the ECPR, as well as its long-term strategic development. To make this task more manageable, members are grouped into five portfolios covering the spectrum of ECPR's work.

Drawn from ECPR Full-Member institutions, EC members are elected for a six-year term, staggered so that six members are elected every three years.

Membership

ECPR membership is institutional and is open to any university involved in the teaching or research of political science. Membership entitles staff and students at member institutions to benefits that include funding, reduced event fees and access to ECPR publications. The ECPR currently has some 340 institutional members worldwide, including 39 of the top 50 European universities according to the QS World Rankings 2017. This figure has grown steadily over recent years, and equates to a network of some 26,000 political science scholars worldwide with MyECPR accounts.

The ECPR's highest level of governance is its Council, comprised of one Official Representative from each member institution. Council performs a number of functions, including electing the ECPR's Executive Committee (EC) every three years, receiving annual reports from the EC and voting on elements of constitutional reform.

Council meets once a year, at the General Conference, and as such will meet this year in Oslo on Friday between 18:00 and 19:00.



Speaker of Council

The Speaker of Council holds a number of responsibilities including chairing Council meetings; proposing amendments to the Standing Orders of Council; liaising with the Executive Committee over business matters and the formulation

of the agenda of Council meetings; serving as Senior Returning Officer for Executive Committee elections and votes on amending the ECPR Constitution; being a general liaison point for members of Council *vis-à-vis* the ECPR. **David Farrell**, MRIA, holds the Chair of Politics at University College Dublin.

Getting around the city

Oslo public transport is run by Ruter AS. Use Ruter tickets on metro, trams, buses and ferries, and on NSB trains in Oslo and Akershus. More information, including ticket prices and maps, at <https://ruter.no/en>. Alternatively, search for 'RuterReise' (journeys) or 'RuterBillett' (tickets) in the App Store or on Google Play.

Tickets and travelcards

You cannot buy on-board tickets, so remember to buy *before* boarding.

Travelcards are plastic cards you top up with tickets or credit. Validate using a card reader. Order at <https://ruter.no/en> or via the app, or buy from staffed sales outlets. A new travelcard costs NOK 50. With a travelcard, you can buy all Ruter's tickets and top up your pay-as-you-go credit at ticket machines.



Tickets are also available from NSB's staffed train stations (such as Oslo Airport and the Central Station); the kiosks Narvesen, 7-Eleven, Deli De Luca and Mix; Ruter's Customer Service Centre and Service Points and bus terminals in Oslo and Lillestrøm.

Metro

The metro operates on five colour-coded lines, and runs from approximately 05:00 (06:00 at weekends) to 01:00 the next morning.

Trams

City bikes / Oslo Bysyssel

These are used for short rides and as a supplement to public transport. They are available from over 100 bike stations in and around the city centre, between 06:00 and midnight every day. A one-day pass costs NOK 49; a three-day pass NOK 99.

To find out how the scheme works, go to <https://oslobysyssel.no> or search for 'Oslo Bysyssel' in the App Store or on Google Play.

Use the app to find the closest available bike. Tap *unlock* when you're near a station, and it will tell you which bike is yours. Ride for up to 45 minutes, and extend the rental for NOK 5 per extra 15 minutes – the app lets you know how long you have left.

You can return your bike to any station at any time. The closest available locks show in the app. Place the nose of the bike in the lock. Wait a bit before you pull on the handlebars to make sure it has locked. Look for confirmation in the app.



Getting to the University from the City Centre

The University of Oslo is on the Blindern campus, easily accessible by metro or tram. From the city centre, it takes approximately 10 minutes by metro and 15 – 20 minutes by tram.

By tram

Lifetime Achievement Award

This €5,000 award is given biennially to a scholar who has made an outstanding contribution to European political science.



The 2017 Award goes to **Joni Lovenduski**, Anniversary Professor of Politics at Birkbeck, University of London. Joni has taught at universities across Europe and the US. She has won the UK PSA's Isaiah Berlin Prize, and is a Fellow of the British Academy and Academician of the Academy of Social Sciences. She is a founder of our Standing Group on Gender and Politics, and was a member of the ECPR's Executive Committee, 1997–2003.

Joni is a figurehead of gender and politics study in Europe. She is a source of inspiration and support to many younger female scholars.

Our jury's verdict

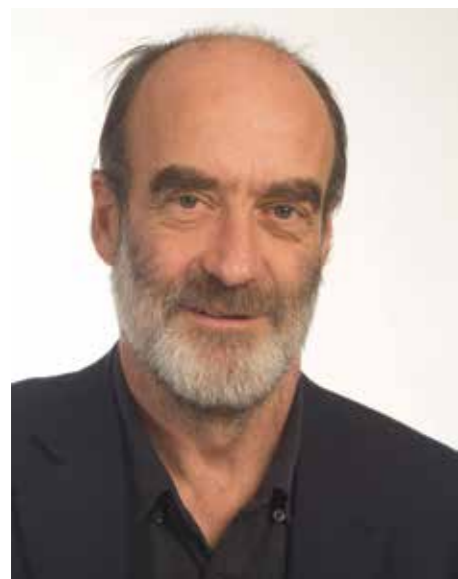
'We recognise Joni's crucial role in defining and developing gender and

politics in political science. She has done so through her many important publications, but also by founding and strengthening organisations, and by representing gender and politics in the wider community.

Spanning more than thirty years, her pioneering research on the political representation of women, the selection of female candidates for elected office and the roles of women in political parties, has contributed new data and advanced new theoretical approaches, challenging the gender-blind assumptions of contemporary political science.

Her research has reached beyond the academy, influencing the recruitment strategies of political parties and highlighting the role of, and challenges facing, women in politics.'

Mattei Dogan Prize



The Mattei Dogan Foundation Prize in European Political Sociology is awarded biennially for a major contribution to the advancement of political sociology.

The \$3,000 prize is presented to either an individual scholar with an ensemble of outstanding scientific publications and constructive professional achievements, or to a team of researchers currently enjoying a high reputation in the international community of political sociologists.

This year's award goes to **Hanspeter Kriesi**, who since 2012 has been Stein Rokkan Chair at European University Institute, Florence. He gained his PhD in Sociology from the University of Zurich in 1976 and became professor of collective political behaviour at the University of Amsterdam in 1984, before being appointed full professor at the University of Geneva in 1988. In 2002, Hanspeter Kriesi took up the chair in comparative politics at the University of Zurich.

Our jury's verdict

'Hanspeter Kriesi helped redefine and relaunch the field of political sociology. His research ranges across social movements, corporatism, direct democracy, elections, populism, and the political consequences of economic crises. His study of a dramatically evolving society has energised a number of research areas with contributions on the challenges – such as immigration, Euroscepticism, and globalisation – facing European society today.

In awarding this prize, we recognise his prolific and much-cited academic output, the quality of his theoretical and empirical contributions over several decades, his leadership and collaborative engagement with senior and junior scholars alike.'

EPS Prize

This £,500 prize, generously supported by publishers Palgrave, is awarded to the author of an article in the journal European Political Science which contributes to the understanding of new trends in political science, or offers an innovative approach to teaching and learning in the discipline. All EPS articles except reviews and keynotes are eligible for consideration.

The 2017 prize goes to **Katjana Gattermann** University of Amsterdam, **Ariella Huff** House of Commons, and **Anna-Lena Högenauer** University of Luxembourg.

Our jury considered that their



prize-winning article *Studying a New Phase of Europeanisation of National Parliaments* pointed to a new trend in national parliaments in the EU, and argued for the need to redirect our studies of these parliaments to better capture this development.

In particular, it argued that a new phase of Europeanisation is evident, where parliaments are increasingly 'mainstreaming' EU affairs, blurring the traditional distinction between national and European policies.

This trend, and the discussion of how to capture it in contemporary research, is especially relevant for readers of *EPS*.

Our jury's verdict

'First, the authors ask: To what extent does domestic decision making in EU states take the existence of the EU directly into account? Their reasoning is a benchmark against which future situations can be compared.

Second, the article summarises recent research about the mainstreaming of the EU after Lisbon.

Finally, the piece explicitly considers the prospects of a future research agenda in this area. For these reasons, this article clearly contributes to our understanding of new and innovative trends in political science.'

Hedley Bull Prize in International Relations



This annual €2,000 award, named after the eminent Professor of IR, was instituted in 2017. It is awarded for a published monograph deemed a substantial and original contribution to theory and/or empirical studies in international relations.

The inaugural winner of the Hedley Bull Prize is **Vincent Pouliot** (McGill University), for his book *International Pecking Orders: The Politics and Practice of Multilateral Diplomacy* (Cambridge University Press, 2016).

Our jury's verdict

'Pouliot's book provides a critical engagement with contemporary diplomacy in the context of inequality in international political life. Using a theoretical approach that builds on social theories, it reveals the hierarchical structuring and social practices that pervade multilateral diplomacy. In his empirical analysis of the politics of diplomacy in

NATO and the UN, Pouliot shows that international pecking orders are complex social forms that the anarchy principle may not fully capture. His work opens up a new research agenda for the scholarly community.'

The Future of the European Welfare States

The financial meltdown of 2008 and the subsequent recession caused similar problems for all European welfare states, including rising unemployment, falling exports, rising budget deficits, and damage to the credibility of their banking sectors. Governments initially responded in roughly similar ways: massive support for the financial sector, and stimulating demand by continuing existing social policies. But bailing out banks, and other measures to save the financial sector, came at a high price. On top of that, rising social expenditure and decreasing taxes and contributions, put public budgets under extreme financial pressure.

The financial crisis and the Great Recession were not initially blamed on the welfare state. In fact, the welfare state was celebrated for how it cushioned the harmful effects of the crisis: stabilising demand and protecting people from hardship.

But then something happened, which Mark Blyth has labelled 'the greatest

bait and switch in modern history': although the fiscal crisis in European welfare states (except Greece) was a consequence of the financial crisis, it became progressively portrayed as its cause. Because the European welfare states took responsibility for the banks' massive private debt by socialising it as public debt, the banking crisis was turned into a sovereign debt crisis. Thus, the problem was reformulated as one of excessive (welfare) state spending and public debt, which had to be battled by a severe politics of austerity.

As a result, the political conviction seems to have become that the costly initial response to the crisis and the recession was not sustainable in the long run because it was causing deficit spending to rise dramatically.

This ushered in a period of austerity that aimed to balance budgets and contain public debt. Governments realised, or were reminded by the financial markets, that deficit spending had reached its limits. Consequently, the politics of reform revolved increasingly around who was to pay for what, when and how.

The outcome of these struggles will determine who carries the burden of financial and economic recovery. The crucial political choice seems to be founded on the conviction that a swift return to a balanced budget is the only route to economic recovery and that drastic retrenchment is the only means to achieve it.

Governments have already agreed on significant public spending cuts, which add up to drastic reforms that induce new distributional conflicts, although more so in some European countries than in others.

European welfare states have been remarkably flexible in adjusting to their changing environments. Their core social arrangements remain so popular that any attempt at radical overhaul continues to meet public resistance. However, under increasing stress, especially in the wake of budget deficits and pressure from financial markets, it is not evident that core social programmes can still be protected through reform; they may become victims of distributional battles or policy drift. Severe budgetary problems, the unpredictable but threatening responses of financial markets and the economic consequences of the financial crisis not only pressure for further reform, but possibly undermine the political capacity to implement those reforms needed to guarantee the continued protection of people against social risks that the welfare state has so far offered.

The future of the European welfare states looks gloomy. Or does it?

The Consequences of the Internationalisation of Political Science Education

Today, many students seek undergraduate and/or graduate education in political science outside the confines of their countries. Academic staff are increasingly hired internationally, and the opportunities for academics to immerse themselves in the cultures of political science departments abroad have multiplied.

Universities promote staff and student exchange schemes, and many American universities offer study abroad programmes for their students or dual degree programmes with universities from other countries.

In Europe, the European Higher Education Area (EHEA) was established to facilitate the competitiveness of European universities by creating a comparable, compatible system that made it easier for students to study abroad.

The Erasmus programme has encouraged shorter-term exchanges, not only for faculty members but also for administrative staff. Joint degree programmes under the Erasmus Mundus scheme make it inevitable that students study abroad.

Strategic partnership agreements seek to encourage the exchange of ideas and research between faculty members of partner institutions. Many American and European universities open campuses in countries such as China, Dubai, Malaysia, Mauritius, Hungary or Uzbekistan. However, such efforts at internationalisation are not limited to the transatlantic area.

The Chinese state – still the major actor in the internationalisation of higher education, directly or through its state universities – has funded international experience for its students and faculty, and offered academic positions to citizens returning home from doctorates earned in the West. Affluent Chinese parents aspire to send their children abroad to earn their degrees, and universities in some countries, including Brazil and Denmark, have looked to hire foreign scholars.

Despite the grand ideas that motivate internationalisation, and the lively exchange of personnel, results appear mixed. Some educational systems resist what they see as foreign intrusion. Others create barriers inadvertently when, for example, administrative staff refuse to work in English (which has dominated internationalisation) because it was not written in their contracts or because they earn too little to make the effort. Other universities pursue internationalisation inconsistently: providing inadequate funding or not offering enough courses for foreign students.

This Roundtable will discuss the consequences of internationalisation. Does the meaning of political science and the way research is pursued change? What does this process mean for political science teaching? Does it encourage innovation, or just create difficulties in terms of teaching methods and the curriculum? Finally, how does this process influence research and publishing trends?

Equality in Recession? Transnational Developments

This Roundtable takes stock of contradictory tendencies in gender+ equality norm and policy development in crisis times.

First, the Roundtable engages with core meanings of equality; how differences formally recognised in strands policies intersect and are woven into complex claim making. What are the implications of complex equality for advancing social justice? How is complex equality linked to basic human rights reasoning? (Anne Phillips).

Second, it will assess research insights from international relations and comparative politics, engaging with literature on transnational politics, norm diffusion, and social movements (Phillip Ayoub). It will look in particular at how transnational mobilisation of marginalised peoples and international channels

of visibility influence socio-legal change across states.

Third, it explores patterns of resistance and backlash to gender+ equality, focusing on negative reactions to increased diversity among elected representatives in Europe and beyond (Mona Lena Krook). Is violence and harassment against diversity politicians on the rise? What are its motivations and what forms does it take? And what are the implications for democracy when the political presence of different groups is undermined?

Fourth, the Roundtable asks how opposition to gender equality can be mapped, analysed and theorised (Mieke Verloo). What is the range of oppositional forms in Europe today and how do 'European' forms connect globally? How are different forms of opposition normatively evaluated by equality researchers?

It will thus ask: How might analysis intertwine with agency? And how should – could – researchers offer public advice on dealing with opposition to gender equality?

Democratic Representation in Interconnected Settings

The standard notion of representation presupposes a demos which selects and authorises representatives to decide on its behalf, demands they account for these decisions, and can punish them for unsatisfactory delivery. It is understood that only the members of the demos are entitled to participate – directly or indirectly – in this decision-making process, while all other subjects remain more or less decision-takers. The accountability of representatives is therefore owed only to these citizens, other subjects being protected by the rule of law, eventual bilateral agreements and a general duty of reciprocity owed to members of the human community. In highly interconnected settings such as the European Union, however, this model of democratic representation fails, for several reasons.

First, the amount of joint legislation

produced through (qualified) majority procedures is extensive, thus disrupting the domestic representation-accountability chains (Scharpf 2009).

Second, the Treaties enjoin 'loyal cooperation' among member-states and create expectations of cooperative and trustworthy behaviour on the part of national authorities. National representatives – in EU institutions and in national ones – must therefore balance responsiveness towards their own constituents with responsibility *vis-à-vis* other national constituencies, an uneasy predicament particularly in times of crisis (Mair 2013).

Third, an extensive jurisprudential interpretation of the four liberties enshrined by the Treaties and the turn to intergovernmentalism during the Euro-crisis have constitutionalised a hyper-liberal polity whose founding principles have never been the object of collective deliberation, creating the conditions for potential domination (Bohman 2007).

Fourth, in a European Union which enshrines the freedom of movement of its citizens and aspires to a regime of open borders, the number of denizens and temporary workers is very high and growing, creating evident inequalities in the way EU citizens can exert their political rights depending on the member state in which they happen to reside.

These developments create a sense of sovereignty loss and a yearning for 'gaining back control'. They also call for new ways of organising decision-making, of including disenfranchised subjects, of fully factoring the externalities caused

to others in domestic decision-making processes, of defining the representative mandate, of conjoining representation and deliberation, and of conceptualising the demos.

This Roundtable addresses these issues from a variety of standpoints, theoretical and empirical, in the hope of teasing out common threads and moving closer to a new definition of democratic representation for the currently highly interconnected context of political organisation.

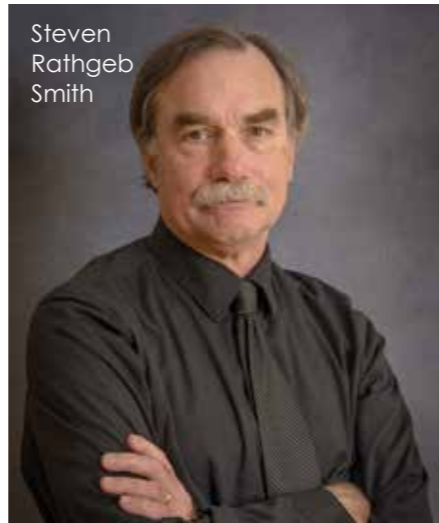

While the election results in France and the Netherlands reassure us of the majority will to curb rising nationalism, we cannot put our anxiety to rest. The anxiety reflects the global shockwave originating from the Brexit vote and from Donald Trump's electoral victory.

In this shifting milieu we have been witnessing the visible erosion of democratic norms in various parts of the world. We are thus increasingly concerned about the grave consequences of the precarious political upheavals for academia.

Where are we headed? What can be done? Where to draw the line between academic research and political activism? How to address the controversial topics pertaining to academic freedom, including freedom of speech, and human rights violation, including defamation and the like? How to negotiate between normative ideals and the reality of academic survival?
